About Our School

Students love our small learning environment where teachers are able to give them individualized attention. They enjoy participating in community activities. In addition, they have the opportunity to learn to read music and play an instrument, as well as to participate in chorus and performing arts-related activities. Parents and guardians appreciate the instructional, cultural, and motivational programs that are the centerpieces of our students' middle school experiences and which also provide many leadership development opportunities, including a college trip to Princeton and a day visit to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. We house a new multimedia technology laboratory. Next year, we plan to launch our school-wide store as well as an opportunity for students to take an overnight trip to Washington, D.C.
