#### **About Our School**

Brooklyn School for Collaborative Studies (BCS) is an Expeditionary Learning School; this means that the curriculum is based on real-world topics and students investigate multiple sources and perspectives before forming and expressing their own opinions. Students make extensive use of technology and a wide variety of library resources including online research databases. Every student takes part in crew (advisory) and has a crew leader who serves as a primary parent liaison. Twice a year, crew leaders coordinate student-led family conferences (instead of parent-teacher conferences) where students explain to their parents how they are doing in school and set long- and short-term goals. Students participate in monthly town hall meetings and have the opportunity to join our Student Council. Students participate in a variety of arts classes each year, including visual art, theater, and music. Parents appreciate that we are a small community where every child has an advisor who serves as parent/school liaison.
