About Our School

Students like the friendly, caring, and nurturing teachers and staff. They feel that they're a part of the I.S. 171 family. There is always someone to talk to in their time of need. Our students enjoy the way we celebrate successes through special assemblies, field day activities, team building activities, Project Boost, Reading Club, Journalism, Language Club, and after-school extracurricular activities offered by Cypress Hill, our Community-Based Organization (CBO). We have infused performing arts into our daily curriculum. Students now have opportunities to engage in martial arts, band, dance, and videography. Parents appreciate our willingness to involve them in decision-making policies through the School Leadership Team. Our parents also play a supportive role in helping us celebrate their children's successes through awards dinners, dances, and assembly programs. With the support of the Center for Educational Innovation – Public Education Association (CEI-PEA), our high-performing students have the opportunity to participate in the Project Boost Program, in which they attend overnight trips to other cities, fundraise for important causes, and participate in the school newspaper. The collaboration with our CBO Cypress Hills Local Development Corporation (CHLDC) creates a seamless day where students participate in engaging after-school activities. Our Brooklyn-Queens Conservatory of Music residency gives our students the opportunity to learn a band instrument. Many of our students later receive scholarships or partial scholarships to continue their studies at the conservatory.
