About Our School

At P.S. / I.S. 184, our vision is to create a true community school where parents, staff, students, and the community are collectively responsible for developing the future leaders of our community and world. Our mission is to raise student achievement, improve instructional practices, and optimize school progress by providing all members of the school community with the necessary professional learning to create effective change. Every year, our school is moving onwards and upwards. In the last 3 years, our enrollment has increased. Our test scores continue to improve; last year, our Math scores improved 5% while our ELA scores improved 3%. This was the 2nd year in a row that we outgained both the city and the district in Math and the 2nd consecutive year we outgained the district in ELA. Last year, 64% of our 4th Grade students were proficient in Math; this was the highest score in the entire district. According to the NY Daily News, our school is ranked 4th out of 23 schools in the district. Additionally, we have implemented the following initiatives this year: Instructional Leads (exemplary teachers providing professional development); Italian American Civil Rights League After School Program (after-school program with homework help, academic enrichment and extracurricular activities for our 6th-8th grade scholars); Creative Arts Institute (for students interested in the performing arts through a partnership with PENCIL); CHAMPS Sports; Mayor's Interagency Task Force on Absenteeism (Student Success Mentors have been assigned to work with our students on improving their attendance); and the Mobile Response Team (works with Interborough Development, Consultancy Center, and the school to provide counseling and support services).
